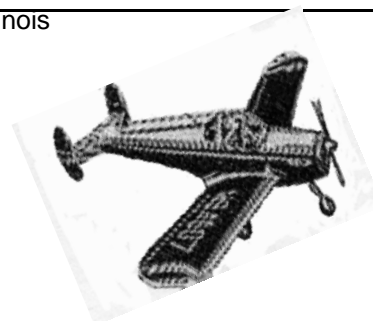

Tough Times and TFR's

As if we didn't have enough restrictions, here comes the Presidential TFR's for the Chicago land area. By now I'm sure you have heard, but if you didn't, please continue reading.

When our new President is in town, we will be restricted from aviating. It will be more important know more than ever to get that briefing from flight service. The TFR will extend outward from where the President is 10 nautical miles with absolutely no exceptions. A 30 nautical mile ring also exists, however permission may be granted to operate within this area providing you either file and activate an IFR flight plan or get prior permission. The flight service station will let you now how to get that permission when you get your briefing. This information was obtained at the last IFR/VFR seminar I attended. Please take the time and do the necessary preflight activities before you even go around the patch. Most of the airports our members fly out of will be affected. The FAA had mentioned more than once during the seminar, they are taking this and other airspace infractions quite serious. The Military has been instructed to do what ever is necessary. If there is anything left, the FAA will prosecute as if it was a criminal offense.

Seminars

Some good seminars coming up may be worth attending. The first is a maintenance and general aviation seminar at Lewis University, Thursday, February 19th from 7:00 A.M. till 7:30 P.M.. Even if you have no aspirations of becoming a mechanic, it is always a good idea to learn as much about our aircraft and its systems. It may make us better and safer pilots and operators. The next two are also at Lewis, Monday February 23rd at 1:00 P.M. and Thursday February 26th at 5:00 P.M. These are almost a must attend. The FAA will be holding two fact finding meetings concerning the modification of Chicago's Class B Airspace area. They have already

held three previous meetings.

Story of the Month

[FAA NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING \(NPRM\)](#)

1000.1A No pilot or pilots, or person or persons acting on the direction or suggestion or supervision of the pilot or pilots may try, or attempt to try or make or make attempt to try to comprehend or understand any or all, in whole or in part of the herein mentioned Federal Aviation Regulations, except as authorized by the Administrator or an agent appointed by, or inspected by the Administrator.

1000.1B If the pilot, or group of associated pilots becomes aware of, or realizes, or detects, or discovers or finds that he, or she, or they, are or have been beginning to understand the Federal Aviation Regulations, they must immediately, within three (3) days notify, in writing, the Administrator.

1000.1C Upon receipt of the above mentioned notice of impending comprehension, the Administrator will immediately rewrite the Federal Aviation Regulations in such manner as to eliminate any further comprehension hazards.

1000.1D The Administrator may, at his or her option, require the offending pilot, or pilots, to attend remedial instruction in Federal Aviation Regulations until such time that the pilot is too confused to be capable of understanding anything.

Lou Bos brought information on scheduled safety seminars in the area. The information was passed around.

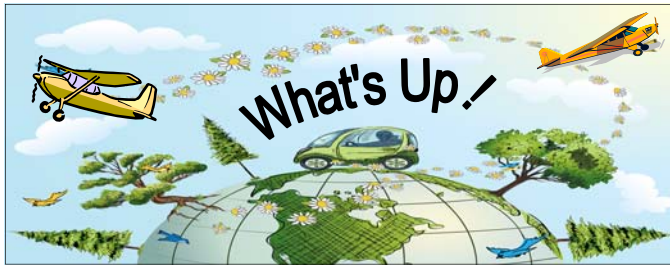
The final details of our flight training scholarship with Windy City Flyers for Dave Moore have been worked out and the scholarship will begin soon.

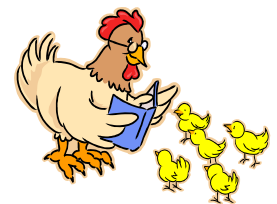

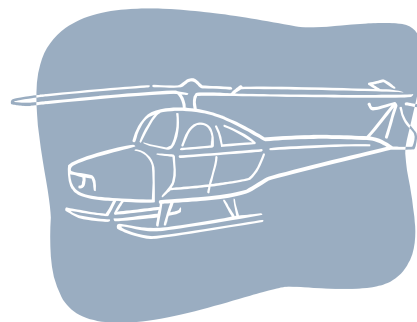
History

Although our chapter had been flying Young Eagles at several other chapter's rallies, our first Chapter 101 official Young Eagle Rally took place on March 2, 1997 at Schaumburg Airport.

Pilots flying that day were Lou Bos, Butch Bejna, Ben Scola, Ron Laade, Stacy Greenhill, Steve Applebaum and Steve Mrowczynski. They flew a total of 40 Young Eagles that day which brought our chapter total to 420.

John Nowicki was our first Young Eagle Coordinator and in his first newsletter article he stated, *"It can only get better from here"* and it did. At our next rally in April, 1997, with the help of sixteen ground crew members and six pilots, we flew seventy-eight Young Eagles.

And now, eleven years later, our chapter Young Eagle total is more than 6,250 and going strong.
